TOPIC: Cybersecurity for law firms in 2020 is a whole different beast than 5 or 10 years ago. Firms are fairly mobile. Workflows are moving to the cloud. New regulations come with strict requirements and penalties for non-compliance. Third-party vendor management is at the forefront of many clients' minds. The ABA has made a strong stance on its expectations of law firms through formal opinions and resolutions. This presentation takes law firms through the aforementioned concerns and poses potential solutions for firms facing the ever-changing technology, security, and regulatory landscape. **THIS PROGRAM WILL ALSO ADDRESS THE SHIELD ACT IN DETAIL AS WELL AS DISCUSS THE POST COVID CYBER WORLD.**
